

How does God want us to act toward others? That question is answered in next Sunday's readings. In Exodus, God tells the Chosen People how to treat strangers, widows, orphans, and others in difficult circumstances, and explains why. Writing to the Thessalonians, St. Paul says that by imitating the Lord they have become models for other believers. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches the Pharisees which commandment is the greatest. Let us allows God's word to penetrate our minds, our souls, and our hearts.

A Message from Fr. Tom —

Coming up later in the month, just on the cusp of November (necessarily) is what we've come to call Halloween. This term, of course, comes from Hallow'een, which comes from All Hallow's Eve. To be hallowed is to be Holy (Sanctus, Santo, etc.). The eve is a vigil, in the Church's long standing tradition, going back to Judaism. In Judaism, which operates on a lunar calendar, liturgical celebrations (because the days themselves) are from sundown to sundown. We celebrate special vigils for all Solemnities (a tick above Sundays, in solemn celebration).

November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints. Thus, its vigil is what we call Halloween. A general day for saints, especially martyrs, began when Christianity was legalized in the Roman Empire (300's), and was celebrated on May 13th. It shifted to November first under Pope Gregory IV in the 700's.

The Church combined several celebrations for the faithful departed on November 2nd, into what we now refer to as All Soul's Day, in the 1,000's. Because of various cultural celebrations, customs have arisen in mocking demons and even taunting death, because Christ is our hope. Yet, while death is one of the last things, so are The Church judgment, heaven, and hell. expresses our need to remember this, with her phrase Memento Mori (remember death, or even remember your death). We're all going to pass, and we want to live in such a way that allows judgment over us to put us on track for heaven (though many/most of us will journey through Purgatory, the denizens of which we pray for on All Souls Day).

We're reminded in the Gospel that there are things of this world and things which belong to God. One of the things which belong to God is our respect for the souls of all human beings, because they are precious creations of God, whom he has invited into his wonderful life. Let us do that as best we can in the Church's tradition, at month's end (and month's beginning).

O God, although we do not know what will happen in Israel in these coming days, we do know that You have protected them in the past.


You are the God of the nation of Israel.
