We are reminded next Sunday that we have all been called to a life of service before God. Malachi specifically addresses he priests, who of all people should not be setting a poor example. St. Paul reminds the Thessalonians that the apostles gave their very selves in their work and ministry. Finally, Jesus warns the crowds what will happen if one exalts oneself. With humble hearts, let us ponder God's word.

A Message from Father Tom —

Soon it will be time for the trio of days that call to mind the end of our mortal coil and cause us to think of the other two parts of the Church: the Church Triumphant in Heaven, and the Church Expectant/Suffering in Purgatory (we're the Church Militant on Earth).

On Halloween (vigil of All Saints) and All Saints Day, we recall the Church in Heaven - all those saints unknown and known. This might be our favorite parishioner Mrs. McGillicutty from our youth who we recognized as a living saint in her apparent holiness and kindness, but is also for canonized Saints who we're fairly certain are with God in heaven due to their evident intercession, requesting miracles for God on earth, like Pope Saint John Paul II.

All Souls Day is the time to remember the suffering souls in Purgatory, who don't have bodies but must still be purified; they weren't able to suffer well on earth and must be cleansed before entering heaven. And so, we offer Masses and indulgences for these suffering souls to aid them in their process of interior conversion and readiness to be face to face with God (which would be painful without purification).

So what for us? We must always strive to be vigilant, holding fast to the Word of Life, prayerfully approaching all our moments, so that we can take our appropriate role in this Economy of Salvation: God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

From Commonwealth Catholic Charities...

—Commonwealth Catholic Charities in Norton, Virginia has asked for our help to provide gifts for children in Foster Care in SW Virginia. CCC is one, if not the largest Therapeutic Foster Care agency in SWVA, which supports children with more emotional and behavioral needs than traditional foster care. They work with other agencies to provide treatment as the children develop life skills, improve socialization skills, learn to succeed in school and develop a positive self-image. Most importantly, foster parents with CCC offer a nurturing and caring home environment to support children that come from extreme abuse and neglect situations.

—In early December, Commonwealth Catholic Charities is having their annual Foster Care Christmas Party and Dinner for over 50 children. St. Anne's has been asked to get gifts for 25 of these children; Saint Anthony parish is Norton will provide for the rest of the gifts. If you can help one child, you are asked to get at least one gift for that child (between \$25-\$50). You don't need to wrap it — CCC will wrap the gifts. We have "wish lists" from the children so you would have an idea what they want/need. 


Topic: "The Saints Come Marching In"
