A Message from Father Tom....

This is the last Sunday we'll celebrate in Ordinary Time (though we have two more weeks of it before the First Sunday of Advent). While Ordinary Time has 34 weeks, the last Sunday is always supplanted by the Solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the Universe. This is a Solemnity which echoes what we say at the inscription of the Easter Candle at the Easter Vigil:

"Christ yesterday and today, the Beginning and the End, the Alpha and the Omega; All time belongs to him, and all the ages; To him be glory and power, through every age and for ever."

Likewise, we've been having gospel readings which speak to judgment and evaluation of how we've lived out our lives. Jesus is the just judge we encounter both at our Particular Judgment and at the General Judgment at the culmination of all things.

This week, we hear the parable of the talents/coins. God gives us gifts and entrusts creation to our care to cultivate and return to him. As Mediator of our Salvation (through his own person, his Body, which is the Church), Jesus returns these gifts to the Father. That is, our verve, our toil, our joy, our productivity, but most importantly our very selves orientated/ordered towards Kingdom of our God is what we offer in our Thus, let us be bold, acting with lives. excellence towards our maker and Lord, rather than in and out of fear of a vengeful God

When Jesus identified himself as the Good Shepherd, his disciples probably recalled the passage from Ezekiel that we will hear next Sunday. God's words are comforting at first, lovingly caring for the sheep, but at the end God stands in judgment, and some sheep God will destroy. This is the kind of shepherd Jesus suggests in the Gospel, separating the sheep from the goats in order to determine who is sent to eternal life and who to eternal punishment. May we listen attentively.
