

A Message from Father Tom...

As the days darken and the ordinary starts to feel more extraordinary, we enter very soon into Advent. This Solemnity this Sunday carries with it the well-known Matthew 25 reading of the separation of sheep from goats. Sometimes we justify service to the poor (Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy) by the words of this gospel: "whatever you did [or didn't do] for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." That becomes commonly projected as "seeing everyone as Christ." But, the invitation is far more beautiful, I think. These are other members of the Body, equally connected but alone as we often find ourselves, and the mercy we can show is the mercy Christ himself would show as "The Head" to a member of "His Body." When we show mercy, we emulate the outward missions of the divine. For, what does it mean for all creation to be rendered subject to Christ? It isn't that he destroys evil with his mighty arm, but that he redirects and subjects all creation to the Kingdom, where God is all in all. That those of evil will be converted and gathered in the Kingdom is the destination of all things, for that is the state for which they were made.

As we prepare for the two-fold coming of Christ during Advent, let us live our lives under the banner of this one goal for all creation: not to divide, separate, distance, or estrange, but to mercifully invite and gather so that we can all march on the pilgrim road together, sometimes suffering, sometimes in great joy, towards the one thing necessary: God as all in all. We might be momentarily separated as we come along the road at different rates and times, but the end goal is still the same. We don't desire ill for any, but rather conversion of heart.

The lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.


Please bring 3 dozen cookies and a few copies of your recipe to share. Please package the cookies as follows:

"Watch!" the final word of next Sunday's Gospel binds together our readings on the 1st Sunday of Advent. Isaiah watched for the Lord, anticipating that one day God would come down from the heavens and rescue the Chosen People. St. Paul exhorted the Corinthians to be watchful for the day when the Lord would return. Jesus himself compared the Second Coming to the head of the house returning at a time you least expect. May God's word remind us to wait watchfully for the Lord.
