A Message from Father Tom...

Tomorrow is another Holy Day — The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (though we have a Mass on 12/31 at 5:30pm as well).

It's a curious thing for us Christians to declare that a creature is the mother of the only deity there is to worship. It is one of the great mysteries of our faith, wrapped up in the mystery of the Trinity. But, it's the kind of "curious" that helps us properly align curiosity away from suspicion and towards interest. This is the same kind of curiosity with which we can try evermore to approach the world. Today, the world is very interested in knowing something in order to disprove it or show contrast with But, the outlook of our own opinions. humanity is intended to be relational. We can encounter another person and desire to know them, in order to will their good (to Indeed, this is what we're love them). called to do. We can be curious towards unity and delight rather than discord and displeasure.

And so, let us, on this Second Sunday of Christmas and cusp of this holy day, remember she who speaks few words in scripture, but greatly ponders things in her heart, towards understanding. Once again, Mary is a model for her children.


