

Last Sunday, on the feast of the Epiphany, we heard the familiar story of the magi, who, directed by the star to Bethlehem, find the baby Jesus. Today we hear of the first disciples, who, directed by John the Baptist, encounter the adult Jesus. That initial encounter changes the entire course of their lives, for, as Andrew insists to his brother Simon, "We have found the Messiah." May our encounter with the Lord, here and elsewhere, influence the way we live our lives as well.

# Scripture for next Sunday *Third Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Jonah 3:1-5, 10

*The Ninevites turned from their evil way.* 

Psalm 25

"Teach me your ways, O Lord."

1 Corinthians 7:29-31

The world in its present form is passing away.

Mark 1:14-20

Repent and believe in the Gospel.

In the first reading next Sunday, God sends Jonah to the huge city of Nineveh, where he warns of God's wrath and calls for repentance. In the Gospel, Jesus comes to Galilee calling for repentance as well. He proceeds to call his first disciples, promising that he would change their lives. They follow immediately, much as the residents of Nineveh turned toward the Lord immediately. As Paul reminds the Corinthians, "time is running out." Let us realize the urgency with which we are called to repent and follow the Lord.

# A Message from Father Tom...

Eli, the priest, was corrupt and not oriented towards a life in the Lord. He went about his days thinking of himself and his tasks. So, when Samuel, who had been dedicated to the Lord, heard the Lord calling him in the night, Eli couldn't advise Samuel properly. Eventually, he realized what was happening, though not through faith, but through logic.


Logic and reason are good, and quite necessary for us to best use our human faculties. But, being able to discern the Lord's call has no substitute.

In the gospel, Andrew believed early that what John the Baptist testified to: that Jesus is the Christ, the Lamb of God.

How are our listening skills: listening for the Lord? Do we more often orient our lives towards ourselves rather than towards the members of the Body and Christ the Head?

As we "prepare" for the penitential season of Lent (starting Valentine's Day this year), let's begin our practice of taking time and attention to listen for the Lord, so that we can reply—

"Speak, for your servant is listening."


