



# **Regulations for Fast and Abstinence**

*Fasting* is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is <u>not</u> permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices are allowed.

*Abstinence* is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence <u>no meat is allowed</u>. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14 and Good Friday, Mar. 29 are days of fast and abstinence.

ALL the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

God's covenant with Noah when he was delivered from the flood.

Psalm 25

#### Mark 1:12-15

# **Stations of the Cross**

*"Via Dolorosa"* (Way of the Cross) sa devotion following Christ's path as He carried the Cross. This pilgrimage devotion dates back to a time soon after Christ's death.



In the 1300's the Franciscans were given guardianship of the pilgrimage route. Placement of Stations of the Cross in churches became common near the end of the 17th century.
