




A Message from Father Tom....

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan."

We are a desert people, even still, going out to the wilderness to be purified, and unfortunately also tempted. As we make advancements in the path of holiness, temptations by The Accuser are never far behind. But, we walk the path our savior trod, where the sand lay dented.

As Jesus withstood Satan's temptations, so will we, with the time-tested tools: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We mortify ourselves against things of the world and lesser goods, recommitting ourselves to devotion to God and love of neighbor. While this is a yearly "program," the intention is to habituate us to these more excellent ways so that we can continue to practice them the rest of the year as well, at least in some way. In this way, year by year, we make cumulative progress in holiness, not anticipating backsliding the rest of the year, but if nothing else, to hold our ground (but hopefully soldier on).
