

## Second Sunday of Lent



As we continue our Lenten journey today, we hear stories of two significant journeys in the history of our faith. Abraham travels to a distant land with his precious son, Isaac, where his devotion and obedience to God will be put to their greatest test. Jesus leads His closest disciples up a high mountain where He will be transfigured in glory. May our practice of the Lenten disciplines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving transform us into more loving and devoted disciples.



## Stations of the Cross Fridays of Lent

"Via Dolorosa" (Way of the Cross) is a devotion following Christ's path as He carried the Cross. This pilgrimage devotion dates back to a time soon after Christ's death. In the 1300's the Franciscans were given guardianship of the pilgrimage route. Placement of Stations of the Cross in churches became common near the end of the 17th century.

Be part of this prayer tradition and join us at <u>6pm</u> on the Fridays of Lent for the Stations of the Cross.

**Soup Supper:** You are also welcome to join us for a simple <u>Soup Supper</u> prior to the Stations which is served at **5:30 p.m.** in the Great Room.

## A Message from Father Tom...

"I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." Neither does God the Father withhold his own beloved Son. In Isaac, we see a type of Christ: he is the only beloved son of Abraham, he carried his own wood for the sacrifice, his Father brings him to the sacrifice, and ultimately, he is spared.

In the case of Jesus our Lord, we were the ones who were spared so that we might become beloved adopted sons [and daughters]. God himself intervenes in a moment which echoes in eternity, making ripples which we encounter in each and every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, including countless descendants of Abraham into the same sacrifice, offering what we could not.

In faith, we are able to abide/dwell/rest in our Lord and Savior, the Christ, who is offered for sacrifice, along with Peter, James, and John. Their terror and amazement at seeing Jesus in his Glorified Body in advance of the Resurrection is how we can and should look upon The Eucharist in adoration, within and outside the Mass.

LENT is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (Ash Wednesday thru sundown Holy Thursday). It is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ. Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays, but we are also called to practice self discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. The giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through giving money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446). In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for those who have declared their desire to become Catholics.



## **Second Sunday of Lent**

The Scrutinies of our Catechumens will be at the 11:30 Mass on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. At these Masses we use the Cycle A readings; at the other Masses we will continue using Cycle B readings.


