


Third Sunday of Lent



Our Scripture today at our **5:30p**, **8:30a**, and **2:30p** Masses are the Cycle B readings: Exodus 20:1-17, Psalm 19, 1 Corinthians 1:22-25 and John 2:13-25.

We will have the RCIA Scrutinies at our 11:30a Masses this Sunday and the next two Sundays. At these Masses we use Cycle A readings; these Gospels teach the Elect about the mystery of sin, and fill them with the Spirit of Christ. This weekend at 11:30 Mass, the readings are: Exodus 17:3-7, Psalm 95, Romans 5:1-2, 5-8, John 4:5-42. For the 1st Scrutiny the Gospel (the Samaritan Woman at the well) tells us that Christ is the Living Water.

Scrutinies are a series of rites (on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent) for adults (the Elect) who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil this year. This is considered a period of purification and enlightenment for the Elect. There are prayers of exorcism which are intended to help purify them from sin and sinful desires. The overall prayers are to help the Elect be enlightened by the Word and grace of God.



A Message from Father Tom...

"Zeal for your house will consume me."

Here, the disciples recall the words of Psalm 69 (or 68 to them). This, we can "recall" too when we contemplate the first reading, where we hear the Exodus version of the 10 Commandments. We know we can derive the 10 Commandments from the two Great Commandments Jesus unites together for us: love of God and love of neighbor. But, we can really and truly see that as zeal for God's house, because our neighbors and ourselves, by our baptism, are part of God's house.

Imagine if we lived life zealous for God and all his house ... that we lived life with that as our driving notion, rather than subsistence or furthering our clan or family tree. That is, imagine if we lived willing the good of the other [person] and The Other (he who is set apart, God).

That imagination is what we've been invited to as our reality: for that is what Love is. Let us be consumed with true zeal for the house of the Lord, all our days.

⊕The Stations, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus' passion and death.



These 14 stations each depict a moment on His journey to Calvary. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced His path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa. Later, for the many who could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that took the form of the stations currently found in almost every Catholic church throughout the world. We are indeed blessed here at St. Anne's to have the beautiful stations that aid us in our prayer journey. If you are not able to join us on Fridays at 6 p.m., you are welcome to come at another time to privately pray the stations.
