A Message from Father Tom...

"Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life."

Hate and love are extremes presented often in scripture to make prioritization easier. We might alternately say "what is my top priority / general order number one / prime directive"?

To help us understand this, let's remember that the two great commandments Jesus gives us are [paraphrased] Love of God and Love of Neighbor. Do notice that lack of "Love of Self" as something explicit and unqualified. We each rightly live our lives outwardly, making our own sacrifice, placing God and neighbor above and amongst our own personal concerns.

In this great mystery, we end up pursuing our primary vocation of holiness by divesting ourselves of pride (the same pride as in the fall in the Garden), in the midst of giving ourselves as a gift. So today and all days, live for the Lord and for the brethren, and you'll have your real needs met along the way.

The Palm Sunday liturgy always focuses on the Passion, but we begin with a short reading from Isaiah, who prophesied of a person who suffered terribly for faithfully speaking God's word. Sound familiar? Indeed, Saint Paul testifies that Jesus "humbled himself... to the point of death". Let next Sunday's scripture passages remind us of the physical and emotional suffering that our Lord endured in order to truly proclaim God's word.

As we journey with Jesus towards Holy Week, remember all those in our world today who carry heavy crosses of poverty, homelessness, and hunger.
