
A Message from Father Tom...

"The poor you will always have with you, and whenever you wish you can do good to them, but you will not always have me."

In the proclamation of the Passion from Mark's gospel, we hear this important "ordering" statement from Jesus. Far from saying the poor were unimportant, Jesus reminds us that due to the fallen state of the world, there will always be poor to serve. But, there would be a defined time the Lord was available to us in the flesh.

Nowadays is slightly different, but the ordering principle Jesus gives us carries on: it is still always imperative to make time with the Lord, especially in regards to what he has asked us to do: "Do this in remembrance of me" (Mass) ... "Could you not watch with me for an hour" (Adoration/Prayer) ... "Go make disciples of all nations" (Evangelization) ... these are all more impactful and efficacious than anything else we could choose to do.

When we order our lives toward the Lord in these simple ways, we become evermore the Lord's friends, for we are following his commands.

Holy Thursday, March 28th

Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7 p.m.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper begins the Sacred Paschal Triduum. Church bells ring during the singing of the Gloria and then remain silent until the Gloria at the Easter Vigil. On this night we remember the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist. The Sacred Oils are presented and the priest washes the feet of twelve parishioners recalling Jesus' washing the feet of His disciples.

Altar of Repose

At the conclusion of the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Holy Eucharist that is reserved for distribution at the Good Friday Service is taken in procession the Altar of Repose in the Chapel. The Altar of Repose will remain open until 10pm. You are invited to stay in private prayer with our Lord at the Altar of Repose.



Good Friday, March 29th

(Day of Fast and Abstinence from Meat for Catholics)

Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 12 Noon.

Good Friday Service of the Lord's Passion at 7 p.m. This service is a somber remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and death. Reading of the Passion, Solemn Intercessions, Adoration of the Holy Cross, and Holy Communion are part of this special service.



Holy Saturday, March 30th

The Easter Vigil Mass in the Holy Night—8:30 p.m. The Easter Vigil begins in darkness. The new fire is lit and the new Paschal Candle, representing the light of Christ, comes into the Church. The Holy Water font and water will be blessed. Our Elect receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist). All the faithful renew their baptismal promises. Once again the church bells will ring out and alleluias will be sung — Alleluia! He is Risen! A reception will follow in the Great Room.


