A Message from Father Tom...

Alleluia, he is risen indeed!

Easter, the Pasch (from "Passover"), is the season we have entered into for the long-haul of seven weeks (so don't burn out early). This is the time in the early Church when the Sabbath was superseded by the Day of the Resurrection, the 8th day, the day of new life: of a new creation. It is, in many ways, the day toward which all creation has been pointing: a day of abiding/dwelling/remaining in God (in the Body of Jesus, who is himself God) which is part of how we understand God's creation of the world. But while this is a large liturgical season, each and every Mass (which is routinely offered daily) is a mini-Easter.

The Paschal Mystery is celebrated and lived out as we bring our hearts to Christ (again, as his Body), who becomes present among us evernew, in his continual offering of himself to the Father. This sacrificial mediation is where we have our life. Jesus is not a courier of prayers, but the prayer itself answered. For all good prayer at its heart gives thanksgiving to God for who he is, and because of his great glory, relies on a trust in times of help. Ultimately though, this trust in God comes from the great miracle of the Pasch (Easter), where God makes good on his own relationship with his Son, raising him from the dead.

We who are Christ's Mystical Body can strive this season to have the trust of Christ throughout all we do, recognizing the one God and Father for who he is, instead of trying to take on his role ourselves. Be not afraid.
