The Lord Jesus was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God.

Every year on this solemnity of the Ascension we hear the beginning of Acts, the book St. Luke wrote to cover the period after Jesus leaves them. Before Jesus returns to the Father, he promises them the Holy Spirit, who will remain with them always, enabling them to be his witnesses all over the world. We hear much the same from St. Mark in next Sunday's Gospel. Jesus has given us our mission and has promised to accompany us in and through the Spirit. Quite simply, what has resulted is the Church, which as St. Paul writes, is the body of Christ. Let us hear our call in the final words of Jesus to his friends.

A Message from Father Tom...

Jesus utters a couple phrases of dramatic import in today's gospel: "love one another as I love you" and "You are my friends if you do what I command you."

He clarifies that he loves us in the greatest way by laying down his life for us. We are to lay down our lives for the brethren. How do we lay down our lives? Is it merely in bodily death? No. Laying down our lives is in the same thought as taking up our cross. We must do it every day. This is a little death: to subordinate our interests to God's and to become a servant to all. This is living with "the other" intentionally rather than begrudgingly.

We're human beings like all others. Will we instead believe that we are a god or God, with our perspective and will begin perfect? We should certainly not. We're invited into friendship with God and we demonstrate our participation in that not simply with belief, but belief which drives us to action.

Those actions are what Christ commanded us to do. Let us march together toward this end and with these guides, so that all can be one in the Kingdom.
