

On the first day of the week, the risen Christ imparts the Holy Spirit. OR


John 15:26-27; 16:12-15

Next Sunday we will hear two different versions of how the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles. One takes place after Jesus has ascended to the Father. The Holy Spirit appears as tongues of fire, leading them to proclaim God's mighty acts in different tongues/languages. In the other, Jesus himself breathes upon the apostles, gently releasing the Holy Spirit upon them. Listening to God's word, may we be reminded that the Holy Spirit comes to us and our neighbor in different ways and at different times.

A Message from Father Tom...

This past Sunday, Jesus emphasizes that we remain in his love and the Father's love if we follow his commands (otherwise, we choose not to subscribe to the promise of the Kingdom and exclude ourselves). This week, with the Solemnity of the Ascension transposed from Thursday to Sunday, we hear a very important command: "go into the world and preach the gospel to every creature." We must also follow this command. In fact, this is highly related and intertwined with the command to love one another as Jesus loved us. The highest "good" for any creature is to fulfill its end. For us and for the creation entrusted to us as stewards, our end is eternal friendship with God. Preaching the gospel in the world to every creature is a large part of doing the most and best we can to will the good of others. But do we do it? Do we preach with our lives? Do we at all times strive to know God's commands and live by them? If we aren't trying to know God and enter into deeper relationship with him daily (which includes prayer, scripture, and spiritual readings), then we are not doing what we think we are. This is not a demand of the faith, this is a command of Christ. Let us support one another in living as we were called.
