

# Scripture for next Sunday Most Holy Trinity

# Deuteronomy 4:323-34, 39-40

The Lord is God in the heavens above and on earth below and there is no other.

#### Psalm 33

"Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own."

### Romans 8:14-17

You received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!"

# Matthew 28:16-20

Baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

In each of next Sunday's readings, the speaker points out God's remarkable uniqueness. Moses tells the people that no other god had ever done all the one-of-a-kind wonders that the LORD had done for them. Saint Paul writes that through the Holy Spirit we have been adopted as God's own children, a relationship with God that is like no other. In telling the disciples to make disciples of all nations, Jesus commands them to baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, a new way of baptism.

# A Message from Father Tom...

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the missionary birthday of the Church.

In Acts of the Apostles, it may seem strange that Luke describes the time of Pentecost drawing near, if indeed that even was happening in what he was writing (forgetting for a few minutes that Luke writes decades after the events took place).

In Judaism, Shavuot, the Festival of Weeks following Passover, was in Greek circles known as Pentecost (~50 days, 7 weeks). This commemorated the giving of the Law at Mt. Sinai and the grain harvest. A harvest of two kinds.

For Christians, the descent of the Holy Spirit brings about new activity also, a harvest of souls by any other name, following the missionary shift of the Apostles. The Holy Spirit descending upon the Apostles is the contingent action of Jesus' Paschal Mystery of Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension. Jesus goes to take on the full mantle of the High Priest in heaven, and sends the Spirit to imbue the ministerial and the lay priesthood, for the effective offering of our sacrifices.

So, we celebrate the tying together of the mysteries of the faith, and that the Holy Spirit's activity on earth continues to animate the Church and all its members.



# What is a Holy Hour?

A holy hour is spending time with God a holy hour means listening — listening to God. The holy hour places you in the presence of God to allow yourself to be open in the silence to hear the Lord speak to your heart.

Christ asked his disciples in the garden:

"Could you not watch one hour with me?"

(Matthew 26:40)
