#### *A message from Father Tom...*

This Sunday is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. While we liturgically bring to mind the Paschal Mystery at every Mass and particularly at the Sacred Paschal Triduum before Easter, this is another day in the calendar when we punctuate our lives with a particular focus on Jesus redemptive sacrifice. We must remember that we are “saved” and our “sins forgiven” in and only in that we are incorporated into the mystical Body of Christ in our baptism, and thus we too ascend to heaven to be seated at the right hand of the Father along with Jesus.

We are incorporated into divine life and relationship through and only through Jesus. This is why the Church has long professed (because of the Apostles) that his is the only name under which we have salvation. Incorporation into Christ, even to be thought of as encapsulation, doesn't diminish us each, but through the blessed unity brings fullness to our existence, for we were made to be in relationship - primarily, relationship with God.

The Eucharist is our continued participation in the mystical body in that we pledge and offer ourselves through and with and in Jesus once-and-for-all sacrifice, continually in progress in the heavenly liturgy. It is his identity to be Lamb Once Slain Who Dies No More, just as it is now our identity to be adopted sons of God, and co-heirs of the Kingdom ... all because the Son fulfilled Adam's debt to the eternal Father and invites us into the life eternal, at the request of his Father.
