

A Message from Father Tom...

Paul asserts in this Sunday's readings that we are (or should be) courageous (not once, but twice). Courage is of the heart (at least, that's its root). Jesus hearkens to Ezekiel's parable about the sprig of the cedar sprouting up into a mighty plant, but reduces it further to a mustard seed, the smallest of seeds.

God works throughout the world, along his own designs for our good, even when we miss the mark, because he desires our flourishes and can work tirelessly to bring it to bear.

Our faith, which we walk by rather than by sight, is what allows us to take courage in the fact of the uncertain. Faith gives substance to a strong heart. Without a firm and true base, a heart can go wild in many directions, but serves its own ends. Faith in the Lord directs our actions so that we can act not simply with philosophical virtue, but with justice and right, towards our shared end of eternal friendship with God.

Let God work in your life and cooperate with his plans, for he intends your good, not your ill.



The Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (*Confession*) is one of the most unique and beautiful aspects of Catholicism. Jesus Christ, in His abundant love and mercy, established the Sacrament of Confession so that we as sinners can obtain forgiveness for our sins and reconcile with God and the Church. The sacrament "washes us clean" and renews us in Christ.

"Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

***As the Father has sent me,
even so I send you.'***

And when he had said this,

he breathed on them and said to them

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

If you forgive the sins of any,

they are forgiven:

if you retain the sins of any,

they are retained."

Jesus calms the stormy seas.

Storms dominate next Sunday's readings, but as both the first reading and the Gospel point out, God dominates the storms. Job learns that God not only created the rain and the sea, but also set limits on them. The powerful waves are kept at bay. In the midst of a violent squall, the frightened disciples are awestruck that Jesus is able to make the strong winds and high waves obey. Next Sunday let us hear how God can calm even the worst storms.
