Summer has arrived and with it, unfortunately, the ever-present chance of summer storms. High winds, tornadoes, thunderstorms, and flash floods make these storms frightening and dangerous. The disciples were terrified when a violent squall came up while they were sailing on the Sea of Galilee. But not Jesus. He rebuked the storm and calmed the waves. Even the forces of nature obeyed him. May we turn to the Lord during the stormy periods of our own lives. May our faith give us comfort and courage, trusting his strength and his concern for us all.

The Solemnity of The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist

Monday is the Solemnity of St. John the Baptist. Our Mass on Monday, June 24, is at 6 p.m. This is NOT a holy day of obligation, but it is a Solemnity. This feast, dating from the 4th century in both East and West, came to be celebrated, in accord with Luke 1:36, six months before the Lord's birth; quoting John 3:30, Augustine found this date (near the summer solstice) appropriate for, after the birth of John, daylight begins to grow shorter, whereas after Jesus' birth, it begins to increased.

(Note: due to a scheduling conflict, the Solemn Exposition/Praise & Worship mentioned in last weekend's Flocknotes has been postponed and will be rescheduled later in July.)

A Message from Father Tom...

"Quiet! Be still!" The Lord who marshaled the oceans at the creation of the world and who governs the times and seasons doesn't fight the waters in the midst of the squall which terrified the Apostles. He instructs them. He instructs them along lines that he attempts to instruct us, to quiet our tempestuous minds and hearts, which always seem to be seeking for meaning and purpose beyond He who can give it and never ceases to give it.

I always imagine Jesus to be saying these things with emphasis, but not with a shout, for he need not try to overpower water, as all creation serves him. Man is by far the harder creature to quiet, as we have free will to turn away from God, our rest.

As we walk along the pilgrim road, let us ever more be docile to the Lord's instruction so as to take part in the peace it offers.

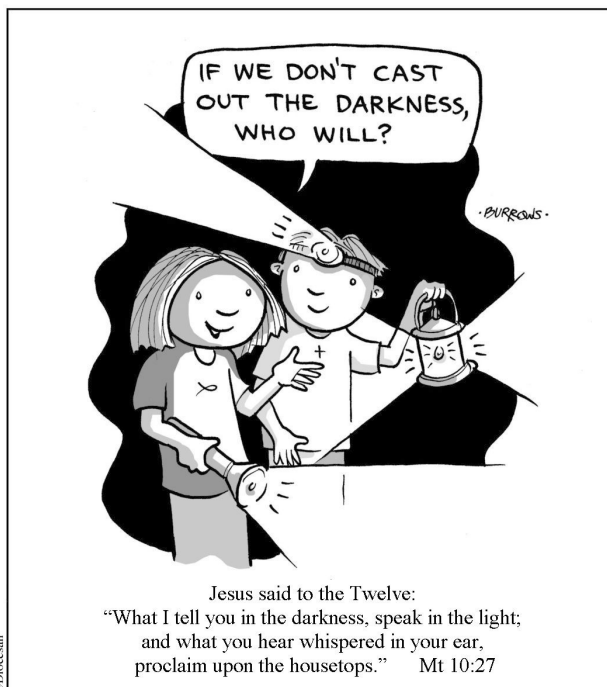

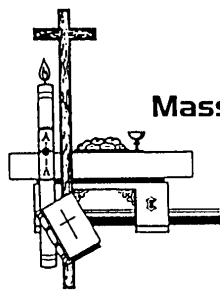
- ⇒ Due to Independence Day shipping schedules, the bulletin deadline for our July 7th bulletin will be Friday, June 28 at 1 p.m.

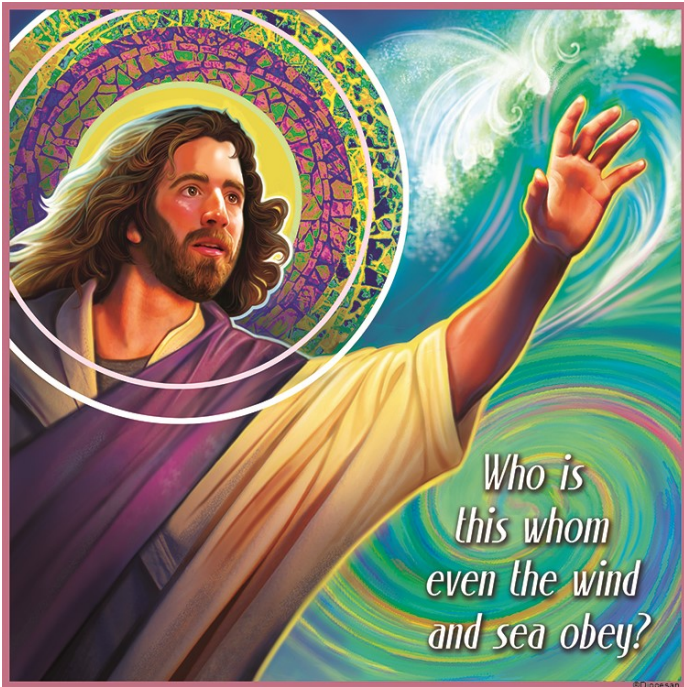
