Cross Catholic outreach was founded to create a meaningful link between parishes in America and priests and nuns working in the Church overseas in the Caribbean, Africa, Asia, Central & South America.

Fr. Theo is currently a Staff Chaplain at the V.A. Hospital, Beford, Massachusetts. He was ordained in 1996 and is an incardinated priest of the Diocese of Orlu, Nigeria. He served as a missionary in the Little Rock Diocese for 15 years (2 years as an assoc. pastor and 13 years as a pastor). He holds Bachelor's Degrees in Philosophy and Theology, Master's Degree in Community Counseling, and a Ph.D. in Counselor Education & Supervision. He is a National Certified Counselor and Licensed Professional Counselor. Fr. Theo's status as a missionary adds to his passion to serve the poor and he is happy to join Cross as an Outreach Priest, and is committed to be an instrument of God's love for the poor. There is not a "collection" taken up for Cross International, but Fr. Theo has brochures available for you if you wish to support this most important ministry that helps the poorest of the poor in our world.


This weekend marks the one year point since I have been with you at St. Anne as the parish's Parochial Administrator. It seems like the blink of an eye, while simultaneously a long journey.

"Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy."


2 Corinthians 12:7-10

The people of Nazareth take offense at Jesus, unwilling to accept that this local carpenter could teach them about God. Let us be attentive to God's voice, both here and wherever we hear it.
