



A Message from Father Tom...

In the Alleluia verse for the gospel this week, we hear invoked: *"the hope that belongs to our call."* We must remember that Christian Hope (the theological virtue of Hope) is not a mere want or desire. It's a promise of eternal life, provided we are friends with Christ (and he tells us how: by doing what he commands - love one another as he loved us).

We see in the First Reading and Gospel how this develops even on earth. Amos was a field hand, a gardener of sorts, who was called by God into more than his usual life. Many disciples were sent two by two in the gospel, each from various other lives as fishermen and the like to prepare the way, to preach, teach, and heal. Many were rejected and faced hardship in their own way, but they relied on God for their needs because they understood that he was, is, and will be their everything. Difficulty might dissuade us, but it did not dissuade Jesus from giving his life for us and calling us into a more blessed life by adoption.

When we suffer in our own call to spread the gospel to every creature, we know through Paul's exposition that we make up for anything lacking in the suffering of Christ (as his Mystical Body).

Perhaps your were out of town a few weekends ago when we were blessed with a visit from Father Theo on behalf of the missionaries who work with the poor in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, South America, Mexico and Central America. Or perhaps you were here and didn't take a brochure home with you. *We encourage you to consider supporting this missionary work* — *Pick up a brochure in the commons or the parish office.* Cross Catholic Outreach multiplies the buying power of your contributions... for example: a \$50 donation provides 333 meals for hungry children and families. Ephesians 2:13-18


Christ is our peace who made both one.
