


A Message from Father Tom...

Father Leo Patalinghug is coming to Saint Anne's!!

Fr. Leo is a Catholic priest from Baltimore, a priest member of a community of consecrated life, Voluntas Dei (The Will of God). He is the founder of an international food and faith movement called **Plating Grace** and founder of the nonprofit group, the **Table Foundation**. He is a best-selling author, acclaimed international speaker, radio and podcast host, and the host of a weekly international food and faith show on EWTN called **Savoring Our Faith**.

His unique background as a chef, martial artist, choreographer and break dancer helps him to connect with people of all ages and backgrounds, appearing on PBS, ABC, CBS and The Food Network where he defeated world famous chef Bobby Flay on "Throw Down! With Bobby Flay".

With food, faith and fun, Fr. Leo hopes to bring people closer together — one meal at a time.

Tickets will be going on sale in mid-August. There will be two events, both with cooking demonstrations:

- On Saturday, Oct. 26 at 7 p.m., Fr. Leo will be doing a live demonstration and there will be hors d'oeuvres.
- On Sunday, Oct. 27 at 5 p.m., there will be a dinner using Fr. Leo's recipes and a cooking demonstration.
