

A Message from Father Tom...

This week is the second part of the Bread of Life Discourse we hear annually. From last week, the further development comes as Jesus indicates that it is his flesh that he will give. If hearers were murmuring before at his claiming to be the Bread of Life, we'll see next week how perturbed and confused they will become.

We have the benefit of knowing about the Last Supper and the crucifixion, where Jesus' is indeed offered as a sacrifice, one we can enter into even today as bread and wine substantially become his Body and Blood, truly. This should always form and reset our imagination to be a Catholic one - how we understand events and time are not always apparent.

We must train ourselves to see as the Lord sees, across time, not merely linearly. This mode of thinking gives rise to our ability to give thanksgiving to God for the seemingly disconnected events which unite to reveal God's providence. It can help us to understand how difficulty, trial, and suffering can lead to something wonderful, just beyond our immediate reach.





Proverbs 9:1-6

Come, eat of my food and drink of the wine I have mixed.

Psalm 34

"Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

Ephesians 5:15-10

Understand what is the will of the Lord.

John 6:51-58

My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink.

"Taste and see the goodness of the Lord", we sing in the psalm again next Sunday; an invitation to the sumptuous banquet God lays out for us. Wisdom provides one of her own in the first reading, presenting knowledge and understanding as a meal we are all invited to eat. Calling Himself the living bread come down from heaven, Jesus invites us all to eat His Flesh and drink His Blood, as we do in the Holy Eucharist. As Saint Paul advises the Ephesians, we give thanks always for this meal in which we physically taste and see the goodness of the Lord.
