

A Message from Father Tom...

Jesus attempts to explain how he has life because of the Father, and that if we wish to have life, we need to remain in him. This is the same term and concept for dwelling or abiding used throughout scripture. Jesus tells us that if we wish to remain in him, we must eat his flesh and drink his blood, which is the life of the world.

Jesus gives himself on the cross as the lamb of sacrifice and institutes The Eucharist at the Last Supper that we may have a means of doing this. This is the Source and Summit of our faith. All our life in God comes from what is offered in sacrifice and the graces which we receive flow from our abiding, dwelling, remaining with Christ. We come to the Mass to offer our sacrifice, in union with Jesus' eternal sacrifice. We participate in that sacrifice by being incorporated into his Body. We are offered as one to the Father.

This is why it is so critical, essential, and necessary that we keep the sabbath holy and come to Mass to participate in this sacrifice. To not do so is a mortal sin (great illness excepting). So, if you miss a Sunday Mass, please take the time to go to confession as soon as possible (we offer at least 5 hours per week).



Scripture for next Sunday Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Joshua 24:1-2a

We will serve the Lord, for he is our God.

Psalm 34

"Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

Ephesians 5:21-32 (or) 5:2a, 25-32

This is a great mystery, regarding Christ and the church. John 6:6-69

To whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. For the Chosen People and Jesus' disciples, this is the moment of truth. They must make a choice: serve the Lord or leave. Joshua, in addressing this question to all the people, gets one response, while Jesus, in addressing all his disciples, receives a different one. Saint Paul tells the Ephesians that we, the Church, are members of Christ's body and that Christ loves the Church as a husband loves his wife. As we hear God's word in the Scripture next Sunday, let us insert ourselves in each reading and make our choice.

His unique background as a chef, martial artist, choreographer and break dancer helps him to connect with people of all ages and backgrounds, appearing on PBS, ABC, CBS and The Food Network where he defeated world famous chef Bobby Flay on "Throw Down! Leo will join us here at Saint Anne's October 26/27, 2024 for Mass, a small mission and cooking demonstration, and a fellowship meal in the gym.
