



Be doers of the word.


Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23 You disregard God's commandments but cling to human tradition.

God's commands take center stage next Sunday. Moses points out that when the Chosen People put God's commandments into practice, other nations will marvel at how just and wise they are. The psalmist assures us that those who act justly will live in God's presence. We begin hearing selections from the letter of James next weekend. today; James continually emphasized the need to put one's faith into action. In the Gospel, Jesus chides the Pharisees for putting the letter of human rules above the spirit of God's commands. When we hear these readings next Sunday, let us reflect on how we follow God's commandments.
