

Women in the New Testament




Little Rock Scripture Study



Did not God choose the poor to be heirs of the kingdom? Mark 7:31-37

He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.

Next Sunday we'll hear the story of a miracle/healing which Jesus performs in a very intimate way. He draws a deaf and mute man away from the crowd, puts His fingers in his ears and, having spat on them, touches his tongue as well. Jesus is here with us in an intimate way as well. He has been just as close to us since we were baptized, when the priest or deacon touched our ears and mouth as well. He is with us as we gather in His name, in the Body and Blood in the Eucharist, and in each other. Listening to the readings next Sunday, let us realize that the One who healed in such a way is intimately close with us too, wherever we are.
