

A Message from Fr. Tom...

Speaking on behalf of others, being offended misunderstanding others' accounts, someone's intention, and misunderstanding the mission aren't artifacts of this age, but can be seen even in our scripture this weekend from Moses' time to Jesus' time (though all time belongs to him). Before we run off on a crusade, it's important that we understand what we're doing with ourselves and what implications it has for proclaiming the gospel to every creature. Especially when it comes to the faith, it is more helpful to look for commonalities than differences, to rally around the good rather than a position. It's more beneficial, for the sake of Christ, to win true hearts and walk along right paths than to be angry or full of consternation about what has been done.

If something has been done which is evil, then how can we work to prevent it the next time? What can we do to teach about why something is wrong? How can we work to heal the person who made the wrong choice? But, we need to first ask whether we understand what has happened and if what we think has happened unfolded the way we think.

Grace builds on nature, and reason is part of nature - it's essential to our faith. Part of that reason is being able to look inside ourselves and take account.
