A Message from Father Tom...

"Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God!" says Jesus in the gospel for Sunday. These are sobering words for disciples then, but more so for us, as it has not become any easier.

The theme running through next Sunday's readings is service and our Lord's commitment to be the servant of all.
