Sacrificial giving and trust in God are a focus of readings this weekend. One of the crosses we carry is supporting the whole Body of Christ, even when it hurts. Our identity is a people assembled from the world, invited into the wondrous life God has promised. This is not an individual invitation alone, but a communal one. Our eternal life is not something we have in solitude, but in relationship with the whole assembly of God.

We know that as we make our way through the world, we substitute our time and resources for family, friends, acquaintances, and strangers. Like the widow at the temple, Jesus exhorts us towards this sacrificial giving, for the good of the Body, for the glory of God, and our own sanctification.

When we give past when it hurts, we build up treasure in heaven and purge from ourselves greed and avarice. When we give and trust in God, like with widow of Zarapheth, we place our hope and trust in his providence rather than in ourselves. This is the right disposition of things for people of good will.

Remember to Pray for VOCATIONS "Do not fear: go, do as you have said."
