

A Message from Father Tom...

Belonging is an often misunderstood concept. In the gospel today, Jesus tells Pilate that his kingdom doesn't belong to this world. That is, it is not subordinate to this world and this world has no power over it.

Don't be mistaken - this world was made good and it is not inherently evil, but it does have quite a bit of evil in it. Kingdoms have organizing principles, allegiances, and responsibilities.

Jesus is the regent of the universe (hence the name of the solemnity today). All things are subject to him, but he doesn't claim the evil of the world, though he can redeem it (and has for those in his Body).

Our year ends this week, and next week is Advent. We prepare again to renew ourselves in Christ, preparing our house, our very selves, for his coming at The Incarnation / Christmas, and at the end of time.

Celebrate Christ the King "Love God with all your being,

"Love God with all your being, and love others as I have loved you."

His love is selfless, compassionate, forgiving, and unconditional. He is a King with a saving and liberating mission: freeing us from all types of bondage, enabling us to live peacefully and happily on earth, and promising us an inheritance in the eternal life of heaven.



The readings next Sunday, on the first Sunday of Advent, cover Christ's three comings. Jeremiah prophesies that God will send a Messiah, who will bring righteousness and justice to the world. St. Paul prays that Christ may permeate the hearts of the Thessalonians, increasing their love for each other and for all. Finally, Jesus tells His disciples that one day He will come again in glory to redeem all those who stand virtuously before Him. May we be reminded that Christ came into this world two thousand years ago, will do so again at the end of time, but also continually comes into our world through our hearts.
