

But for now, let us consider Mary and Joseph, just days before she would give birth, struggling to make their way up an unfamiliar and dangerous road, hoping to make it to a warm, comfortable place to stay in the city of David. 
The countdown is nearly over; our preparation in the short run is at a close.

Tuesday and Wednesday, the Solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, which is a holy day of obligation (like Sundays) is with us and we come together in a special way on it.

Easter and Christmas are the two greatest solemnities of the year and serve as beacons to all of Christendom to draw together, even if we've been "away." This is what happens in a longer stretch of time as well, as all of time is pulled together for the coming of the messiah.

We have heard and will continue to hear in the readings that the prophets foretold him and we get the real sense that history has been directed toward the moment of Jesus' birth.

Let us conclude our interior preparation and enter into the mystery of our redemption, as we share the peace of Christ with our family, our friends, our work, and all we encounter.
