

A Message from Father Tom...

This next week, I go in search of the child Jesus, but not with the mind of Herod. Hopefully, it's with the general intention of the wise men, or at least what we believe in faith the wise men were doing.

I'm headed down to my annual retreat in Hanceville, Alabama. In my time on retreat, I try to listen more attentively to the voice of the Lord with a few less voices around than at home at Saint Anne, so that I can follow where he leads, in search of the king of kings and lord of lords, in and with my heart.

This is the great opportunity and challenge for us all at Epiphany - to bring our gifts to bear in service of Christ, across nations, boundaries, cultures, and between people.



# Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek epiphainen, a verb that means "to shine upon", "to manifest", or "to make known".

Thus, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: visit of the Magi (Mt. 2:1-12); baptism of Jesus (Mk. 1:9-11); and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11).

The **Christmas Season** extends thru next weekend, the Baptism of the Lord, on January 12. Continue to celebrate and rejoice in the celebration of our Lord's birth in this joyous season of the Church year.

On January 13 Ordinary Time will begin again and run until March 4 (which is the day before Ash Wednesday).
