

# A Message from Father Tom...

This Sunday ends the Christmas season, the shortest season of the year (less than three weeks), unless you count the Sacred Paschal Triduum (which is really just one liturgical day).

The fire with which Jesus baptizes us, which we hear about in the gospel, is a fire of zeal. Think of the Apostles at Pentecost. They received tongues of fire, then went out and changed the world, spreading the gospel to the ends of the earth.

The bishops (their successors) still have work to do - with which we participate. Jesus, baptized in the Jordan, receives "the Baptism of John," but we received Jesus' "real" baptism, the Paschal Mystery. We die to death as he does, and we rise to life as he does. We participate in his Body. He submits to a baptism for repentance, as someone who was sinless, so as to sanctify water for our use in being adopted as brothers by his Father.

Baptism begins this life, but it is a life of participation, which requires a seeking, yearning, and often clawing towards God, contra mundum (against the world). When the Second Vatican Council calls for "fully conscious active participation" it is this interior participation, this willful desire, by which we seek to reciprocate the love he has shown us, by inviting us and sending us on mission (as the Father did Jesus, as Jesus did with the Apostles).

Do you take up the charge with your whole heart?

How can you better participate today?

#### LITURGY NOTES...

Today, January 12, with the Feast of the Baptism the Lord, we end the Christmas season and we begin **Ordinary Time**.

- Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle 33 or 34 weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Time (Universal Norms, 43).
- ◆ This year Ordinary Time begins on Monday, January 13 and continues through Shrove Tuesday, March 4 (the day before Ash Wednesday) and the beginning of the Lenten Season.
- Ordinary Time will resume again when the Easter season ends, that is, on Monday, June 9 (the day following Pentecost).

Jesus transforms water into wine.

In next Sunday's first reading, Isaiah celebrates a transformed Jerusalem; what had been forsaken and desolate is now delightful and — foreshadowing the Gospel — espoused. Paul tells the Corinthians that the Holy Spirit transforms each and every one of them, though in different ways. Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus transforms water to wine, saving the newlyweds from terrible embarrassment. May we never overlook God's power to transform our lives.
