

A Message from Father Tom...

At the beginning of our gospel this weekend, which is the beginning of the gospel according to St. Luke, we hear a bit of a preamble, explaining the circumstances and method of the writing of the gospel, the Good News. He writes his gospel (and the book of Acts) as if to a person, Theo-philus, Godlover, and he does so acknowledging that he is not an eye witness or what he considers a minister of the word. He is another Christian in the line responsible for preaching the gospel to every creature and nation.

Just as those who listened to Ezra announce the book of the Law to the people upon returning from exile, Luke has heard and believed, and so passes on those words of truth to us. We also are in such a line as Ezra and St. Luke; we are in the Body of Christ and have been sent to do the same. We must investigate our experiences of the word of God, order them, and present them to those we meet, so that they too may participate in our hope.

Ours it not a faith to hide away or to subordinate to prevailing winds, but it is a shining example which directs us to the highest good for us (eternal rest and friendship with God), to which all people of good will have been invited. Let us fulfill our mission with full hearts, swelling to the point of bursting for love of God and love of neighbor.

Scripture for next Sunday *Presentation of the Lord*

Malachi 3:1-4

The Lord will come to the temple.

Psalm 24 *"Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord!"*

Hebrews 2:14-18 Christ became like his brothers and sisters in all things but sin.

Luke 2:22-40 (or) 2:22-32 Mary and Joseph present the Lord Jesus in the temple.

It's not every day that we get to hear from three different prophets, let alone three who see the Lord physically present in the temple. For Malachi, it's anticipatory: he foresees the day when the Lord will come to the temple to purify the people of the covenant. In the case of Simeon and Anna, they recognize the Messiah in the temple though Jesus is not even six weeks old. Moved by the Spirit, Simeon testifies that in the baby he sees salvation. Like the prophets, we hope that one day we too will see our Savior.


God of all creation,
