



A Message from Father Tom...

We are blessed with a faith that not only has been revealed by God, but because God made all things through the Son, all things have intelligibility. Likewise, we are made in the image and likeness of God, and thus can (among other things) reason.

In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he uses some very simple logic which follows from their desire and lived experience. It's a good reminder to us that if we think something about the faith is wrong or incorrect, more likely than not, we have misunderstood something more fundamental in the faith. We might have incorrectly formed a conclusion by the instruction of the world, but we do not look to the world for answers - we look to the faith, foundationally.

This notion of reasoning can be found in Luke's version of the beatitudes, where not only are positive statements made, but consequential negative statements are made as well. For, if the positive ones are true, the antithesis must also be so. In the same thrust of his statements in the gospel, when we place our faith in things of the earth and store up our riches and rewards now rather than in the Kingdom, we become creatures of a decaying world, rather than citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven.


PRO-LIFE ROSARY...

Love your enemies, Jesus teaches his disciples. Bless them when they curse you, give more to them when they take from you, turn the other cheek when they strike you. Luke doesn't tell us how the disciples react, but this is a radical teaching. However, we get to see mercy practiced in the first reading, when David chooses to spare his enemy, Saul, when given the chance to slay him. Listening to next Sunday's readings, let us consider why we should choose mercy over getting even.
