A Message from Father Tom...

In our readings today, we can hearken to recent previous readings about what defiles us (hint: it's what comes out of our mouths, stemming from our hearts). Thus, it behooves us to be well prepared interiorly, so that as we come to act in the world, being known by our fruits, the fruit we bear can be pleasing to the eyes, pleasing to the tastebuds, and nutritious for the body.

It's heartening to know from Jesus' instruction about disciples and teachers that it is possible for well and fully trained disciples to be like their teachers. It reminds us that both interiorly and exteriorly, we must always strive to be like Jesus, who is the fullness of righteousness, perfection of wisdom, and abounding in kindness. This requires active and conscious action as well as participation in the action of others (not in the least way in the liturgy).

We never extinguish the need to act towards Christian perfection, which ultimately is the act of a servant, available at the master's beck and call. We do this by deepening in knowledge and in strengthening our relationships.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics.

Regulations for Fast and Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is <u>not</u> permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence <u>no meat is allowed</u>. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.
