This jubilee year reminds us that we are pilgrims of hope. Our lives are a pilgrimage and the season of Lent is a concentration of that journey. This time of penitence, of sacrifice, and of suffering is our pilgrimage to the cross, the scene and sign of Jesus' greatest sacrifice. But our faith tells us that neither the cross nor death is the end. Therefore, we can be pilgrims of hope, confident that our journeys through Lent and through life will not end in death, but in new life. May our hope for salvation encourage us as we approach the holiest week of the year.

On this 5th Sunday of Lent (cycle C readings at our 5:30p & 8:30a Masses), we hear of Jesus saving the life of the adulterous woman, rescuing her from certain execution, giving her a new chance at life by forgiving her. Truly, as we sing in the psalm, the Lord has done great things for us.

At the 11:30a Mass on this final Scrutiny Sunday, (with cycle A scripture readings) we hear one of the most dramatic stories of the Gospels: the raising of Lazarus. We are invited to consider what sins are binding us so we can free ourselves and find new life in Christ.

A Message from Father Tom...

Jesus' instruction to accusers of the woman caught in adultery is something we must all keep in mind, especially when our supposed remedy for sin is a further sin (murder). We find it quite acceptable to accuse people privately amongst our friends and even publicly online, calumniating them, which is itself a sin.

Jesus doesn't want us to ignore sin, but he also wants a sinner to repent: not to die, but to live. As we are all sinners ourselves, we should take great solace in this. If we take pleasure in the public punishment of other people, whose lives we do not fully know, we have committed a sin ourselves and have forgotten that we too have lives that others do not know.

We yearn for people to understand the difficulty of our lives (though we dare not expose that difficulty publicly) so that our poor choices make sense, but do not give others grace when they have their poor choices exposed.

Let us not be like the hypocrites. Let us let God be the judge, giving us the space to be merciful and walk with those we meet so that we might understand them better and help them.



Isaiah 50:4-7

The suffering Servant speaks to the weary.

Psalm 22

"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Philippians 2:6-11

Jesus emptied himself, and God filled this emptiness with exaltation.

Luke 22:14—23:56

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We sing some of the saddest words in all of scripture in the psalm next weekend: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Isaiah resisted this despair as he was struck and spat at, professing his confidence in God. Paul testifies that Jesus was willing to empty Himself, to humble Himself, accepting even death on a cross. In the Passion, we will hear Jesus pray to the Father, "not My will but Yours." May next Sunday's readings reassure us that even in our worst despair God will never truly abandon us.
