No morning Adoration/Confessions or weekday Mass Saturday, <u>May 3</u>.


Extra Parking... Just a reminder—if the closer parking lots are full, there are parking spots next to the Saint Augustine Center (enter on Chester Street), and parking next to Saint Vincent de Paul Center (enter on Oakview). And if you are "able bodied", even if you get here early, perhaps you could plan to not take the "up close to church" spots so the elderly and those with mobility issues can park closer. Thanks.

Roof Work: This summer we'll have some of our membrane roofs replaced which have reached, exceeded, or are about to hit their end-of-life. This should resolve some leaks in the church and some places in the school. A generous gift this year (as was the case with roof repairs to the commons & church office previously) has taken us most of the way in this effort but we will need to replenish our building fund to be sure we have the ability to catch up on deferred maintenance and keep up with maintenance. We'll talk more about that in October when the Finance Council presents this fiscal year's annual report.

A Message from Father Tom...

Do we feed others with the Word of God? The disciples leave the Sanhedrin accused of disobedience in expressing Jesus as the Christ/ messiah and Lord. They were held captive for doing so and will be again. They leave this authoritative body with the intention to go through whatever it takes to continue their evangelization (the sharing of "good news.") It is good news that there has come a messiah; it is good news that it was not merely a man, but God; it is good news that he expanded our life and relationship with God, evidenced by his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. It is truly good news. Peter is given a particular charge as one who has been redeemed from denial to feed the flock of God. He does this by his teaching, preaching, and priestly activity of offering the assembly's sacrifice.

This is the same charge priests have today. But as we all have a share in the baptismal priesthood and the baptismal prophet-hood, we all must share the responsibility of feeding the sheep with what we have: the Word of God. We do this with each other all the days of our lives: we read scripture and listen for God to speak to us. Then, we ponder it in our hearts, watching and waiting for the daily moments to be witnesses to each other, all the while living this gospel, this good news, we have absorbed [and internalized]. Especially in a time when society does not encourage the priesthood (for whatever fears or concerns), we all must take responsibility for these offices into which we are baptized - a baptism which we all recently renewed in the Easter Octave.

Scripture Readings for Next Sunday Fourth Sunday of Easter—

Good Shepherd Sunday

Acts 13:14, 43-52 Paul and Barnabas preach to the Gentiles. Psalm 100 "We are his people, the sheep of his flock." Revelation 7:9, 14b-17 The Lamb of God is our shepherd who leads us to life-giving water. John 10:27-30 No one can harm one of Jesus' lambs. Next weekend, on Good Shepherd Sunday, we first hear

Saints Paul and Barnabas shepherd both Jews and Gentiles who chose to join the early church, urging them to remain faithful to the grace of God. In the psalm, we proclaim that we too are sheep of the Lord's flock. In a vision, John sees the Lamb of God shepherding a great multitude to springs of life-giving water. Finally, Jesus tells us in the Gospel that He gives all His sheep eternal life and no one can take that away. May listening to God's word increase our faith in our Good Shepherd.
