The Nicene Creed

On the 20th of May 2025, the Catholic Church and the whole Christian world remember with gratitude and joy the opening of the Council of Nicaea in the year 325. The great gift of this first ecumenical council is the **Nicene Creed**, professed by Christians every Sunday throughout the world.

The late Pope Francis wrote:

"The Council of Nicaea is a milestone in the Church's history. The celebration of its anniversary invites Christians to unite in a hymn of praise and thanksgiving to the Holy Trinity and in particular to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, 'consubstantial with the Father', who revealed to us this mystery of love."

When the Church celebrates the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed, we also celebrate with our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, and we will profess with him, in every church throughout the world, the faith that unites us as disciples of Jesus Christ throughout the centuries.


