



Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Corpus Christi

Genesis 14:18-20

Over bread and wine the mysterious Melchizedek blessed the Lord.

Psalm 110

"You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek."

1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Every time we eat the Lord's body and drink His blood, we proclaim His life-giving death.

Luke 9:11b-17

The feeding of the multitudes.

In the first reading next Sunday and the responsorial psalm, we are reminded of Melchizedek, the first priest mentioned in the Bible. He brought Abraham bread and wine, the same food and drink that Jesus transformed into His body The Gospel story of the feeding of the multitudes through the multiplication of five loaves and two fish reminds us that God's generosity is overflowing, able to satisfy us

all. Let us listen to God's word, so we can go out and become the Body of Christ for a world hungering for God's presence.

Eucharistic Procession: The 11:30a Mass on Corpus Christi will conclude with a Eucharistic Procession.
