Today we come to both celebrate and receive the Body and Blood of Christ. In doing so, as we hear Saint Paul say today, we proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes again. Yes, we proclaim Jesus' death on the cross — difficult as it was to accept at the time, and still painful to consider — for it lead to His triumph over sin and death. *Our sin, our death.* The Body and Blood of Christ, which we receive and celebrate today, is our path to new life, to life in Him. Like a procession with the consecrated Host, the Body and Blood of Christ is a sign and symbol of our journey to new life in Christ.

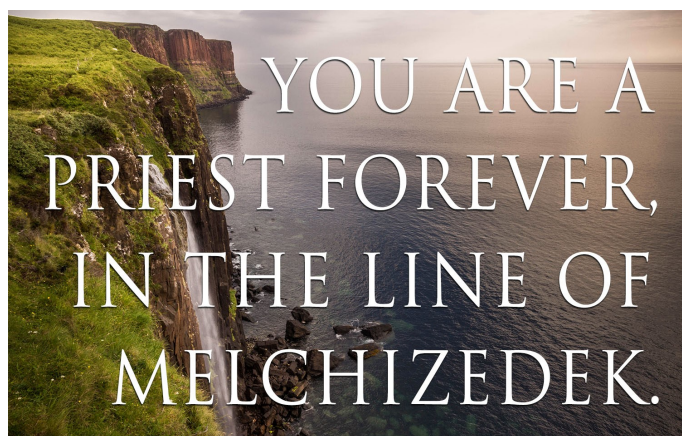
A Message from Father Tom...

In the first reading and the responsorial psalm, we hear about Melchizedek. We also hear about Melchizedek in the Roman Canon, the First Eucharistic Prayer (that we use on Solemnities and several other Sundays). He is the "priest king of Salem" (as in Jerusalem). We hear Salem sounding similar to "Shalom;" it means peace. So, he is the King of Peace. He offers bread and wine to God Most High. The psalm, which is of David, invokes God speaking to David's "Lord;" in our tradition, we read that as Jesus (much in the way we hear of the Son of Man in Daniel). Jesus is thus connected to Melchizedek. We say Jesus is "in the line/order of Melchizedek" in that he isn't a priest of the Levitical priesthood (the priests who offered sacrifices in the Temple), but is surrounded by a much older tradition. Melchizedek is found to be without parentage and without death. With all these things combined, we say that Melchizedek is a "type" of Christ. The reverence Abraham shows him supports this notion. That Melchizedek offers bread and wine, which continued through the Passover, and Jesus' own Paschal Mystery is what brings significance to his appearance in scripture.

As we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ this Sunday, let us recall that these are gifts from God that human beings aided in the production of and distribution of, both of the physical elements, and the spiritual elements.

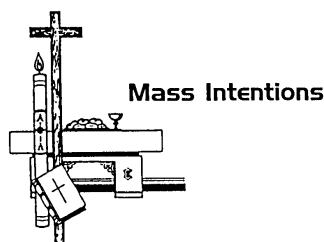

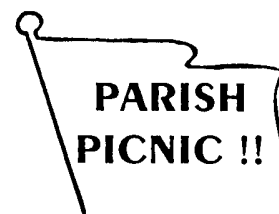

**Scripture for next Sunday
Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul**

Vigil Mass, Saturday evening, June 28:

Acts 3:1-10

A lame man is cured by Peter.

Psalm 19

"Their message goes out through all the earth."

Galatians 1:11-20

Paul recounts his conversion.

John 21:15-19

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?"

Our usual Sunday readings are preempted next Saturday evening by selections that give us a taste of Saint Peter's and Saint Paul's lives. We hear Peter invoke the name of Jesus to heal a lame beggar, Paul describe his calling as a revelation, and Jesus entrusts Peter to tend His flock. As we listen to these stories of Saints Peter and Paul, may we be inspired by their witness and their ministry.

Masses Sunday, June 29:

Acts 12:1-11

The angel of the Lord rescues Peter.

Psalm 34

"The angel of the Lord will rescue those who fear him."

2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18

"I have finished the race."

Matthew 16:13-19

"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Because next Sunday we celebrate two saints who lived during the time that the New Testament was written, our readings feature significant events from their lives. We hear how Peter is freed from prison by an angel the night before he is to be executed. Paul, knowing that he would soon give his life for his faith, writes a farewell to his close friend and fellow disciple, Timothy. In the Gospel, Peter proclaims Jesus as the Messiah, the Christ. May their strong faith in the Lord be a model for us.
