



Today we celebrate the two principal apostles of the early church. Saint Peter and Saint Paul took two completely different routes to their vocation. Peter was called personally by Jesus, travelled with Him during His entire ministry, and became the preeminent disciple among the Twelve. Paul, on the other hand, persecuted the early church until he was called and converted by the Risen Lord on his way to arrest Christians in Damascus. May these two saints remind us that God calls us all at different times in our lives and in different ways.


There are traditions which still echo to this day in the Church because of these pillars.




