A Message from Father Tom...

Hospitality is not be overlooked. In the first reading and gospel, the notion of hospitality arises, but in seemingly conflicting ways. However, there is no real conflict. God isn't angry at Abraham because he provides hospitality (far from it); God isn't unhappy with Martha that she is serving. But, Jesus wants Martha to be at peace and have rest rather than be anxious and worried.

God never wants us to be anxious or worried; he never causes us to be anxious or worried. Those concerns come from the flesh or from the evil one.

God provides a path of peace and rest by operating within the safe boundaries he gives us, through trust in him. How many of us perfectly follow the law of the Lord, so that its perfection might refresh our soul? What if we did? What's the most we might lose by completely assenting to what the Lord asks and offers? Eternal life is to gain.
